 This dog was observed having diarrhea ranking 6-7/7 on the Purina fecal scale and containing mucous. He is BAR, eating and drinking normally, and no vomit has been observed.
ASSESSMENT & PLAN:
 Per Dr. Morrison, starting diarrhea protocol medications with metronidazole and extended fiber support. Stools will be monitored for improvement.
INFORMATION TO GO OVER WITH AN ADOPTER:
 This animal is being treated for diarrhea.
 Diarrhea can be caused by many sources including intestinal parasites, bacteria, viruses, food sensitivities, indiscriminate eating of things, metabolic disease, stress, and more. When an animal has diarrhea at CAHS, the overall health of the animal is noted, the animal is monitored, and given medical care. Some causes of diarrhea can be spread to other animals or even people so it is recommended that you keep the adopted animal separate from your other resident animals for 2 weeks post-adoption and symptoms resolve or otherwise recommended by your primary veterinarian. It is important to clean up stool right away, to consider bathing the animal if they get stool on themselves, and to wash your hands.
MEDICATIONS:
 Panacur Granules: Mix 1 pre-dosed packet (50# dose) with food every 24 hours for 6 days. Start 7/23, End 7/28.
 Metronidazole 250 mg: Give 2 tablets by mouth every 12 hours for 6 days. Start 7/23, End 7/28.
 Advita Probiotic Supplement: Mix 1 packet with food every 24 hours for 10 days. Start 7/23, End 8/1.
 ProPectalin Tablets: Give 2.5 tablets by mouth every 12 hours for 10 days. Start 7/23, End 8/1.

Our vaccination protocols in shelter may vary from that of a primary care veterinary hospital due to the number of animals under our care and the risks of potential disease exposure. All cats/dogs at CAHS receive FVRCP/DA2PP+ L vaccines following the American Animal Hospital Association (AAHA) guidelines. At time of intake, if vaccines are unknown or have lapsed, AAHA recommends that adult cats/dogs in an individual home environment may not need boosters or can receive booster vaccines in 3-4 weeks while shelter housed cats/dogs can be boosted in 2-3 weeks. Kittens/puppies in an individual home environment can receive a series of booster vaccines every 3-4 weeks until 4 months of age, while shelter housed kitten/puppies can be boosted sooner at 2-3 weeks until 5 months of age. Adopters should follow up with their primary veterinarian to discuss vaccination protocols specific to an individual pet and their home environment.

Please note that for animals with an unknown history, their age is based on physical examination findings including teeth and body condition.

It is recommended that within 14 days of adoption, you consult with a primary care veterinarian of your choice who will be able to provide ongoing care for your new pet. Unless stated in the medical record, follow-up vaccinations, deworming, flea prevention or other treatments may be necessary and should be discussed with your veterinarian.

Heartworm - Adult Dog:

This dog has tested NEGATIVE for heartworm at time of intake examination. This dog has been started on monthly heartworm preventative. The American Heartworm Society 2019 Guidelines recommend retesting for heartworms in 6 months from date of original heartworm test then every year thereafter along with year round heartworm prevention.

Dental:

Mild to moderate dental tartar or calculus were seen during the intake examination. It is recommended that an adopter consult with their family veterinarian about at home dental care and scheduling an anesthetic dental cleaning with full mouth dental x-rays. If the dental tartar continues to build up, dental disease can occur contributing to health problems such as kidney failure, liver and heart disease.

TO BE DISCUSSED AT THE TIME OF ADOPTION:

Thank you for adopting and caring for a dog that is overweight! Obesity in pets can cause a variety of problems such as joint problems, respiratory compromise, diabetes mellitus, decreased life span and many other issues. To help your new friend live a long happy life, we suggest feeding your dog for his/her ideal weight. Along with appropriate feeding, we recommend a routine exercise schedule. This can consist of daily walks, lengthy play time sessions, etc. For training purposes, some low calorie treats options include Cheerios, carrots, blueberries. While at the shelter, your dog was fed Purina One Chicken & Rice dry food twice daily for its estimated ideal weight. It is important that adopters follow up with their primary veterinarian to discuss weight loss options and to monitor the rate of weight loss for their pet. Gradual weight loss of 1-2% of their body weight per week is best.

Adopters should follow up with their primary Veterinarian to discuss vaccination protocols.</p> <p>Leptospirosis Vaccination: Leptospirosis is a disease that can affect human and animals, including your pets. All animals can potentially become infected with leptospirosis. The bacteria that cause leptospirosis are spread through the urine of infected animals, which can get into water or soil and can survive there for weeks to months.</p> <p>This animal has been started on a vaccination series for Leptospirosis. This vaccine requires a booster at 2-4 weeks to be effective. CAHS will revaccinate in 2 weeks, however if this animal is adopted before then, it is the responsibility of the adopter to receive the booster vaccine from their primary veterinarian. Adopter should discuss this with their primary veterinarian. Leptospirosis vaccines are administered subcutaneously with the Distemper combination</p>		

vaccination (DA2PP) in the right forelimb.

As with all other vaccines, this vaccine may not prevent the animal from becoming sick but should lessen the severity of the illness and decrease the amount of time the animal may shed the bacteria.

For the night following surgery you may offer your pet small amounts of food and water. Your pet may not want to eat/drink and that is OK. If your pet does decide to eat/drink, he may vomit. Your pet may be nauseous and disoriented tonight but this should resolve by the morning after surgery.

Your pet has received an injection of pain medication that will last for 24 hours. If you feel that your pet needs further pain medication, please contact your regular veterinarian.
